Key books for this half term:














Autumn books: These books are all about Autumn and the changes we will see outside. They include information about pumpkins, seeds, leaves and British wildlife.




Books about Christmas

Christmas Books: These books will help us to learn about Christmas and how people might celebrate.

Learning experiences: Autumn: Going for an Autumn walk and looking for signs of Autumn, colour mixing orange by combining red and yellow to make leaf handprints, exploring pumpkins, using tools such as hammers and golf tees, screws and screw drivers on the pumpkins, investigating our findings from our half term homework (Autumn collection bags), thinking about animals that live in the woods.

Learning experiences: Bon-

fire Night: Creating firework pictures with chalk and neon paints, watching a firework display and talking about what we see and hear, learning about a person from long ago—Guy Fawkes.

Learning experiences: Birthdays

Preparing and having our very own birthday party for Sam our class puppet, wrapping presents, learning party games, making cards, singing happy birthday, decorating cakes, making decorations, playing with balloons.

Learning experiences: Diwali

Learning about the story of Rama and Sita, finding out about special times and places for our Hindu and Sikh friends, making diva lamps out of clay, making rangoli patterns, decorating hands with mehndi patterns.

Learning experiences: Christmas

Learning about the story of the first Christmas, finding out about special times and places for our Christian friends, making Christmas cards, learning and performing Christmas carols, decorating our Christmas tree, making baubles and cooking chocolate reindeer.


Gross Motor Skills (big body movements)

PE: We will be working on dance skills this term using real dance. In this unit, the focus will be on

developing every child's ability to play with others and share. Children will learn and develop shapes and circles and create sequences of movement with these through partnering and artistry.

Fine Motor Skills (small movements of the hands)

We will continue to develop of fine motor skills through the use of tools such as pencils, paintbrushes, tweezers, screwdrivers, spray bottles, knives and forks and scissors. We will focus on developing hand strength, dexterity and manipulation of objects using our fingers. We will learn to hold a pencil with the tripod grip, copy shapes and write letters.

Number: We will use NCETM

Mastering Number to support our teaching of the following skills:

- · Comparing sets by matching Use the language of comparison: more than, fewer than, an equal number
- · Exploring the concept of 'whole' and 'part'
- Focus on the composition of 3, 4 and 5
- Practise object counting skills Match numerals to quantities within 10 and verbal counting beyond 20

Shape Space and Measures: We will be:

- •Comparing objects relating to size and length using words like long/short, longest/shortest, tall/short, tallest/shortest
- Exploring and naming 2D shapes -
- circles, rectangles, triangles and squares and talk about them using informal and mathematical language: 'sides'. 'corners': 'straight'. 'flat'. 'round'.
- •Notice and correct an error in a repeating pattern.
- •Begin to describe a sequence of events, real or fictional, using words such as 'first', 'then...'

Communication and Language:

- Children will be encouraged to engage in story times and to join in.
- · By building positive relationships, children will be encouraged to talk to teachers and friends in play.
- •We will introduce talking partners using the picture prompts to learn rules to communicate well.
- Children will be encouraged to talk about their ideas and give their opinions during circle times and using the share chair to talk in front of the class.

How can you learn at home? Celebrations:

Talk to your child about what you celebrate at home. Look at photos of previous things you have celebrated. It could be birthdays, a festival, a wedding etc. Talk about why these times are special. If you have any photos of your family at a celebration please send them in to the school email or via seesaw where you will find this overview. We will talk about what your child has celebrated at

Fine motor skills:

Make home made play dough together and use it to play dough disco. There are lots of videos online. Here is one that we like at school. 'I like to' playdough action song - YouTube

Maths:

Practise counting to 10 and then 20 by rote. Encourage your child to hear the rhythm as you count. Miss a number and see if they will join in. Practice counting objects to 5 and beyond with 1:1 correspondence by touch counting or moving objects into a line. Roll a dice and see who has more/fewer/ equal

Reading: Make time for a bedtime story each day. Encourage your child to look at the pictures and talk about what is happening on each page as you read it. Ask them what, where, who, why gues-

Your child will be bringing a reading book home from school. This may include words or pictures. If it is a picture book please encourage them to talk about the pictures and discuss what is happening with them. If it is a book with words please press the sound button under each letter and support them to say the sounds then blend them together to read the words. Search for our key book being read aloud on voutube. Listen to them together and encourage them to use our key vocabulary on the reverse of this sheet.

Writing: Your child may bring home sound sheets or spelling homework in a yellow book. Please help them to complete these. Encourage the tripod grip to hold the pencil when writing.
